Red Cross: Setting the record straight

RED Cross volunteers have been dismayed by how information about the way the charity handles donations given to assist those that have been affected by the bushfires has been taken out of context and spread by social media and news outlets.

Claims have been made that the Red Cross will keep up to two thirds of the money that has been donated to cover other possible future disasters, however according to the president of Red Cross, this is not the case.

Rumours have also accused the Red Cross of stockpiling money but members of the charity want the public to know that distributing the money is not as easy as everyone would like. The charity must make sure that they are not being scammed and therefore those needing assistance do need to go through the process to receive funds. If you are in need of a grant please go to www.redcross.org.au/grants.

The charity has confirmed that they will use up to 9c out of every dollar for administrative costs but also wants to remind those who are worried that this figure is a maximum and not a set amount. Due to the amount donated it is expected that the Red Cross will use less than this and be able to put the remaining money back into providing relief for affected communities.

Red Cross encourages anyone who wants to keep track of their plans and spending of the bushfire relief donations to visit www.redcross.org.au/bushfirefunds.

Volunteers also want to communicate that they do not make decisions around where donations are spent, after some were subject to verbal abuse after these accusations were made about the Red Cross.

Community Recovery

Local voices and local support will be front and centre for bushfire recovery efforts across Towong Shire.

Following a very challenging start to the year for communities across Towong Shire, Council wishes to express our gratitude to all emergency services, agencies and volunteers for their ongoing contributions. It is our priority to work together with communities to put sustainable recovery plans in place, knowing that there is a long road ahead. A number of initiatives have already been implemented to help ease the financial pressure and fast-track the rebuilding process.

In the Upper Murray, a Community Recovery Hub has been set up at the old Primary School campus in Corryong. The hub will bring together multiple agencies under the one roof, providing bushfire affected residents with a single destination to access recovery services and programs. Council is also working with other communities across the municipality who are bushfire-affected to understand what support is most needed. A series of community planning meetings will be scheduled in the coming weeks, giving community members a chance to provide input into recovery plans.

Business Registration Fee Waiver

Council has resolved to waive its business registration renewal fees (including food premise, prescribed accommodation and health act premises) for all businesses within the Shire and to refund those businesses that have already paid for 2020. Contact Council directly on 02 6071 5100 to discuss.

Minister Backs Bushfire Affected Businesses

On Wednesday the Minister for Small Business the Hon. Adem Somyurek visited Towong Shire, announcing on behalf of the Andrews Labor Government \$10,000 for Business Victoria's Local Events program. The welcomed support is in addition to the \$2.2M already provided by State Government. The grant will be used to provide dedicated seminars, training workshops and events to Towong Shire businesses in partnership with council and business chambers. Mayor Cr David Wortmann said the funding will help local businesses bounce back following the bushfires.

Tickets On Sale For Upper Murray Fundraising Concert

The Rise From The Ashes Fundraising Concert Weekend in Cudegwa is less than three weeks away and organisers are urging people to get their tickets early.

The concert, on Saturday February 29 and Sunday March 1, is at the Cudgewa Football Netball Recreation Reserve, in one of the worst affected areas razed by the Upper Murray Fires.

Organising committee member Jo Humphrey said the weekend event will be more than just a concert.

"It will be a weekend of music, markets, auctions, food and fun for the kids," Mrs Humphrey said.

"This event is as much about lifting the spirits of locals, as it is about fundraising and encouraging people to come back to our beautiful district and support the locals by spending their time and money here at local stores and local accommodation."

"To make it possible for people to use local accommodation we have a few shuttle busses running from around the area, with the addition of limited un-powered camping sites available in the neighbouring paddock for a small fee.

"The concert doesn't start until 11am each day, so we are also encouraging people to head out for breakfast at the many local cafes to show their support."

At very short notice, the organisers have managed to secure some big name

national bands as well as a range of hugely talented local artists.

"We are very excited to have James Blundell and Sara Storer playing the concert as well as popular locals Red Belly Black, Danny Phegan, Adam Crossman, Jammed Up, Phil Holmes, Lion Bear, Nathan Vaccaro, Adrian Clark, Emma Black, Left Arm Orthodox and Lazy Harry and we are hoping to announce more soon," Mrs Humphrey said.

"We know this will be a fantastic event and we are encouraging everyone to grab their tickets. All the money raised has gone, and continues to go, directly to the victims of the Upper Murray bushfires for items such as farm supplies, feed and fencing. The money is not only for individuals, but the whole community including local sporting and community groups who have been directly affected.

"But it is important to remember this is not just about fundraising, but also about bringing the community together and helping lift their spirits through music as well as bringing in new people to the region to show their support for all of those affected by the bushfires."


