## Principal's Report

### Remote and Flexible Learning Survey results

I would like to again take this opportunity to thank the school community for their understanding and support during Remote and Flexible Learning (R&FL). The student and parent survey results clearly show we are all making the most of the current situation, along with recognising the extraordinary work and dedication of our teachers during this time. It is clearly evident that our school community is resilient as work closely together throughout this significant change in teaching and learning.

### Staged return to face to face teaching

Following advice from the Chief Health Officer, the Victorian Government has advised that schools can begin a phased return to on-site schooling. The same approach is being taken by all government schools in Victoria.

**First Stage** - senior secondary (Year 11 and 12 VCAL, VET and VCE) students will return to school from Tuesday 26 May. Year 10 students undertaking VCE studies, including VCE, VET, VCAL studies, should also attend school for these classes where practicable. If this is not possible, our teachers will make sure the work provided to students attending at school is also provided online.

All other students, Year's 7 – 10 will continue Remote and Flexible Learning (R&FL) from home until Tuesday

9 June.

For those students who cannot be supervised at home and vulnerable children, the existing model of on-site schooling will remain in place during the two-week period from Tuesday 26 May to Tuesday 9 June. The current process that we are using to enable parents and carers to indicate the days or part-days for which on-site schooling is required will continue for this two-week period.

**Second Stage** - all other year levels will return to school from Tuesday 9 June.

Once a year level has returned, all students will be expected to attend school as normal.

This means if you choose to keep your child/children home after their year level has returned to on-site schooling, we can no longer support their learning from home, however lessons will continue to be available on Compass. If your child will not be returning to onsite learning for health or medical reasons, please contact your child's Engagement Leader.

If your child is ill or is feeling unwell, they must not attend school. They must remain home and seek medical advice.

While the Chief Health Officer has advised that students will not be required to maintain physical distancing at school, there will be a number of important changes to our school operations, consistent with health advice. This will apply until further notice. I will provide more detail

about our local school context as soon as possible, but it is important to note that changes will include restrictions on access to the school site for anyone other than immediate school staff and students. Our school will continue an enhanced cleaning routine and will encourage frequent hand washing.

We understand that some families may feel anxious about this move back to classroom teaching and learning. I can assure you that this decision has been taken on the basis of the best health advice available to our state.

## Health Tips

### Week 5 – Ensuring that Online Mental Health Resources are Credible

Research shows that it common for people to research their symptoms, come to a diagnosis and even look at treatment options online, prior to seeking face to face

support. This is particularly common for those living where there is a lack of face to face mental health resources, or where face to face support cannot be afforded. Mental health workers should discuss the risks and benefits of doing this, and support people to use the correct mental health sites. So, how do you check your mental health sites to ensure they are providing the best quality information?

1. Does the page have clear aims at the top? Seeing this will help you understand the purpose of the site, and what the site entails
2. Is the information you see relevant?
3. Can you see where the information has been cited? For example, is there a reference list that you can access at the end of the page or is it in the text? This will show that other information has been used to help write the site, therefore knowing that the site is not 'opinion-based'.
4. In the references, can you see when the information was reported? Mental health information is changing regularly.
5. Is it balanced and unbiased? Some sites will use words and phrases to encourage you to seek help, without outlining the risks. Information should be transparent.
6. Does it provide details of additional sources of support and information? Sites should have links to support if needed.
7. Does it display both risks and benefits of treatment

options? It is important to be well informed of treatment risks.

8. Does the site have clear information on how the organisation is funded? You can find this at the bottom of the home page, and will benefit from engaging with sites that were supported by the Australian Government or large, non-for-profit mental health organisations.

Some examples of credible resources are:

- beyondblue: Provides information about depression and anxiety tailored for consumers, professionals and young people
- Black Dog Institute: provides information about depression and bipolar disorder for consumers, carers and professionals.
- BluePages: provides information about depression for consumers, includes reviews of evidence for various medical, psychological and self-help interventions.
