Teaching and Learning Our Core Business!

The results of the 2023 Parent, Guardian, Caregiver Survey were released last week. Progress is measured in % positive endorsement - that is the percentage of parents who responded with "Agree" or "Strongly Agree")

In relation to Teaching and Learning, three out of the four categories showed improvement from last year and our % positive endorsement was higher than the state average.

Our areas showing improvement were:

- **High Expectations for Success:** 84% positive endorsement above the state average of 78%. The questions relating to this area were:
- o Teachers at this school expect my child to do his/her best
- o This school celebrates student achievements in all areas
- Student Motivation and Support: 72% positive endorsement well above the state average of 58% The questions relating to this area were:
- o My child gets extra help with learning from teachers when needed
- o My child feels motivated by his/her teachers to learn
- Effective Teaching: 71% positive endorsement above the state average of 65%
- o Teachers are enthusiastic and positive about teaching
- o Teachers provide useful feedback and respond to the learning needs of my child
- o My child can explore their own interests when it is related to their class work
- o I understand how my child is assessed


The fourth area relating to teaching and learning was **Stimulating Learning Environment.** Our positive endorsement rate was 65%, which was just below the state average of 67%. The questions relating to this area were:

- o This school provides diverse programs for my child's interests and abilities
- o The academic standards at this school provide adequate challenge for my child
- o The teachers are very good at making learning engaging We appreciate the time that parents, guardians and caregivers have taken to provide us with feedback on our school and we look forward to implementing strategies to address our areas of challenge.


