Year 7 Step-Up Program 12th and 13th of December

Students can arrive from 8.45am and meet at the Student Study Centre (SSC) by 9am (large green building behind the lockers). A TSC staff member will be at the front gate directing students. Students should wear their school uniform, have a broad brim hat and bring a pencil case, lunch and water bottle. Students travelling on buses for 2024 can travel on their allocated bus. Students should have snacks and lunch or can purchase items at school canteen. School finishes at 3.20pm. If families are onsite, they are required to sign in at the office. Students will participate in a typical Year 7 timetable and have their 2024 teachers and REAL learning mentors. Families are invited to make an appointment at the uniform shop on the 12th or 13th December. This will be open from 9am – 4.30pm.


