## 2024 Homework Program

We are excited to update you on our homework program for 2024. The school has used part of the Equity funding to upgrade our homework resources from Years 7 to 10 in Mathematics and in Years 7 and 8 in English.





STARTING NEXT YEAR, STUDENTS IN YEAR 7 WILL WORK THROUGH 'DAILY LANGUAGE PRACTICE 1 AND YEAR 8 STUDENTS WILL WORK THROUGH 'DAILY LANGUAGE PRACTICE 2' AS PART OF THEIR ENGLISH PROGRAM.

#### **Mathematics**

In 2024, Year 7 to 10 students will be set regular mathematics homework. The homework will be based on the Mathsmate Program. This involves the completion of one set of questions per week for 8 weeks each term. The questions frequently reinforce the learning across all areas of the mathematics curriculum. The questions

set will be differentiated at the appropriate level for each student. It will be the responsibility of each student to bring in the completed set of questions to class each week for correction.

## English

Starting next year, Students in Year 7 will work through 'Daily Language Practice 1' and Year 8 students will work through 'Daily Language Practice 2' as part of their English program. The purpose of the book is to help students become familiar with regular homework habits while also completing regular literacy practice.

The English team will run a program in classes to preteach concepts, provide modelled responses and provide time for students to mark their work. One of the features of the book is that it has an online copy of the answers. These would be attached to the following week's lesson plan. We are going to run a weekly catch-up session during lunchtime for students who do not complete the designated homework.

The school has invested in the program by subsidising the price of the books so that families can purchase the book for \$10 from the front office. Please do so at the start of next year. If you need assistance, the office staff will be happy to help you. If books are lost or damaged throughout the year, spare copies will be available to be purchased.
